MAX ERNST. ZWISCHENWELTEN

Max Ernst (1891–1976) is one of the great shapeshifters and intellectual innovators in the art of the 20th century. Throughout his life, his work was characterized by intellectual curiosity, experimentation and inventiveness. An early protagonist of Dadaism, pioneer of Surrealism and ongoing inventor of new artistic techniques, he created a unique oeuvre that defies any clear stylistic definition. His pictorial worlds are creations of a seemingly limitless, yet very precise fantasy, which he stimulated by exploring experimental techniques. In a well-calculated balance of chance and control, new or extended techniques such as collage, frottage (rubbing through), grattage (scraping method) or décalcomanie (knock-off technique) served to explore the unconscious, the visionary and the fantastic. Not only on the basis of sheets of the famous Frottage entitled »Histoire Naturelle«, the exhibition conveys an impression of Max Ernst's desire to experiment and visionary will to express himself, but also through intimate paintings, watercolours, collages, graphics and some sculptural works. With almost 50 works from the Wilfried and Gisela Fitting Collection as well as from the Hans Bolliger Collection of the Kunstmuseum Bonn, the exhibition spans an arc from the beginnings to the late work, focuses on the 1920s and 1950s and invites visitors to immerse the imaginative pictorial worlds of Max Ernst. CAROLINE ACHAIKTRE. SHIFTINGS

The first museum solo exhibition of Caroline Achaintre (* 1969, lives in London) in Germany gives an insight into the memorable work of the German-French artist. Achaintre transfers traditional techniques such as tapestry, ceramics and watercolor into the present and explores the boundaries between abstraction and representational. Her ceramics, watercolours and imposing large-format tapestries are invitations to the free play of imagination and allow wondrous, animalistic figures and mask-like formations to appear. Achaintre's sources of inspiration are images from high and pop culture, which develop a life of their own in her works. In addition to art-historical reference points to German Expressionism, »Primitivism« and the Arts and Crafts movement, the horror, heavy metal and science fiction genre is just as important to her as the subversive spirit of Central European carnival and carnival customs. Achaintre develops her powerful tapestries with the technique of tufting, in which individual wool threads are shot through the screen from behind with the help of a pressure gun. They seem like mysterious relics of an unknown culture and unfold both a strong physical and sensual presence. (Source: *Kunstmuseum Ravensburg*)

At prime time, the "Fernsehfilm der Woche" with the title "Die Welt steht still" will be shown on ZDF. In the drama with Natalia Wörner as the leading actress, the corona pandemic is filmed. The focus is on a senior physician who and her team must master the first weeks of the corona crisis medically while social life is changing rapidly. The impressive images that take place in the film at the Konstanz Clinic were shot in the former Hospital 14 Emergency Helpers in Weingarten - as is already more than clear in the trailer.

2G-Rule:

Fully vaccinated persons are people who have not yet been proven to have contracted COVID-19 and have a proof of vaccination on paper or in electronic form and received the last required individual vaccination more than 14 days ago.

Fully vaccinated persons are also persons who have been ill with COVID-19 and have a proof of vaccination on paper or in electronic form and have received a vaccine dose. The documents must also show that they have survived a COVID-19 illness.

Convalescences are people who have been proven to have tested positive for the coronavirus with a PCR test. The test must have been carried out in the past 28 days to 6 months.
